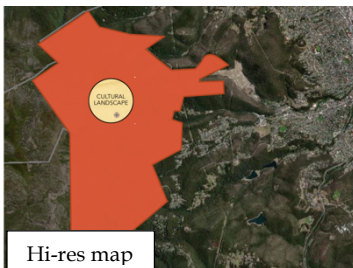


# THE HERITAGE HEART of THE MOUNTAIN PARK MAPPED



Hobart local history group ENSHRINE has combined 14 historic cultural heritage categories and over 150 heritage sites to produce a 4-minute illustrated and animated historic heritage map of the Mountain. (Map animation [here](#)).

The layers include Geo-heritage locations and iconic 'Living wonders'; the Country of the muwinina people; Adventure points like the historic bush track network, rock climbing routes, ski runs and stone shelter sheds; convict forestry coupes and other historic workplaces; tourist destinations and beauty spots; scientific fields; artistic landscapes and literary 'Mind Fields'; rustic huts; political flashpoints and ceremonial grounds.

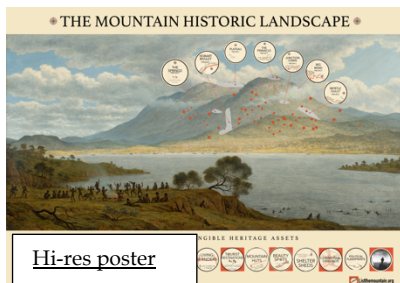

These historic heritage assets, both tangible and intangible, combine to make the Mountain 'one of the most culturally significant associative cultural landscapes in Australia, and one of the most significant and wonderful examples of an organically evolved cultural landscape in Australia,' says cultural historian Dr Gwenda Sheridan.

When all the layers of associative and organic cultural landscape are bounded, the area is approximately 1000 hectares. Wellington Park is 18,000 hectares in total.

ENSHRINE will be displaying the map and telling some of the Mountain's best stories at the kunanyi Mountain Run hub in Wellesley Park, South Hobart this weekend. Friday 8th 4pm-6:30 pm. Sat 9th 8:00am-4:00pm. Sun 10th 8:00am-4:00pm
